The Principal said that the key issues affecting Recruitment/Attention/Retention are, as always, transport, the Curriculum offer, the pull of the former school and friends. The College team are working hard to make new Students feel welcome in the new environment.

The 42-Day Census date this year falls on Wednsday,18 October, and the numbers on role will dictate the anticipated level of 'lagged funding' in 2024/2025. Currently, the College budget plan is for 2050 Students.

Enrolment 2024/2025 now starts up again with the Open Day on Saturday, 7 October 10:00 – 14:30 hrs.

8.2 Student Retention/Attendance 2022/2023 Report: The Principal presented the report and noted the key issue of Retention:

**Retention** – At this point in the Academic Year the College concentrates its attention of the needs of the Students in Year 12 who may be expected to move on to Year 13 in

2023/2024. Pastoral support and guidance are offered to those who are unsure and need specific support. In addition, the intention in the new Academic year to concentrate pastoral support and care for Students at the early stages of their attendance at the College. Currently the overall Retention is 96.8% [from Enrolled] and is up on the previous year, and broadly comparable with similar Colleges nationally.

#### Attendance -

Overall attendance is 92.3% which is better than that for the City of Bristol Schools and Academies, in South Bristol at an average 85%, and Attendance is a concern for all Schools, both Primary and Secondary in Bristol. Comparing the College figure with National College data, also reflects on the lower average Attendance issue here in the Southwest.

#### Discussion -

Not all answers in detail were immediately available, and regular reports are already provided to the various Governors' Committees on these topics. What is evident that the South Gloucester and South Bristol cohort of 16-19 year olds in on the increase, which is good news for the College. On the downside the recent announcement of a new 16-19 Free School, is much debated among professional educators in the City and South Gloucestershire, as not being necessary. As noted above the recent announcement by the Department For Education [DFE] over the summer vacation will impact variously on the College financial planning going forward. But the impact of the Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete [RAAC] crisis on Government funding is still unclear. The College Marketing Team is 'geared up' to promote the College's:

9.2 College Self-Assessment Report 2022/2023/QIP 2023/2024 [Update]: The Vice Principal [Curriculum Quality Innovation] explained that the Quality Improvement Plan [QIP] considers the recent Office for Standards in Education Inspection Report and also follows consultation with other similar Sixth Form Colleges nationally about the content of their Self-Assessment Reports.

In the case of the College, the QIP is built up by each faculty setting their own target objectives for the year, and the College Management then brings these together to form the overall plan for the College in meeting its agreed objectives. The QIP will be subject to review and amendment as the year proceeds.

The Summary page [page2] sets out the key themes:

- Professional Learning
  - o Expert Teaching and Staff
  - o Inspiring Curriculum
  - o Brilliant Teams
- Personalisation
- Inspiring Learners
- Expert Learners
- Engaged Learners
- Precision
- Teachers
- Leaders

Discussion centred on the following points:

- [1] Learning is the key element in the plan, but all the elements need to be taken together, along with other important issues, such as Student Attendance and Retention and skills.
- [2] Relationships play a key role and the introduction of a daily Reflection imbedded in the lesson at the start of the day helps to create the ethos.

- [3] Some of the important areas in the QIP include the employability, careers and safeguarding.
- [4] Catholic Social Teaching and activities such as Catholic Fund for Overseas Development [CAFOD] are an integral part of the Religion Philosophy Ethics programme, in addition to the options available in the Enrichment programme.
- [5] The Governors' Committees, variously within their respective Terms of Reference will receive feedback on progress during the year.
- [6] The essential points were noted by the Student Governors who underlined the importance of being a welcoming community, and building, and of ensuring the Students are informed about their progress in their chosen subjects.

The Board of Governors noted the report.

- 9.3 Summer Results 2022 Overview: The Vice Principal [Curriculum Quality Innovation] presented the report. The report presents three types of available data:
  - ALPS A-Level Performance System

This grading system is used by most Post-16 providers, and allows the College performance to be compared against national benchmarks on a scale of 1-9:

- Score 1–3 the top 25%
- Score 4 6 the 50% range
- Score 7 9 bottom 25%
- 6 Dimensions Value Added Six Dimensions Report this measure takes account of the individual Student's prior attainment and progress within the College. So, a Student with a low average GCSE score at entry who attains a C-grade at A-Level will have a high Value Added.
- Headline Attainment a raw percentage score, which can be used in comparison with other provides and also for the College to compare its performance against previous years' attainment. The changes in process adopted during the pandemic means that only the data from 2019 can be utilised this year.

The Vice Principal [Curriculum Quality Innovation] noted that there will be a full analysis of the data at the meeting of the Board of Governors on 17 October, and highlighted several areas of good performance, and the Applied General results were excellent, and those areas of concerns that are being addressed.

- Student Funding the Day 42 Census date and the current number of Students on roll means that the 'lagged funding' for 2024/2025 will be up on the current year. There is also the possibility of additional in-year funding for 2023/2024.
- Sports Development the works are almost complete but there has been some 'over runs' relating to the drainage works and the road access. The contract cost has risen accordingly. Negotiations with Bristol City Council have been long and challenging, but the Council will transfer the ownership of the triangle of land bordering to the Broomhill Road to the College at a cost of £40k. The College has proposed a down payment of £20k with the remainder to follow in instalments.
- Title to Land The Governors asked whether the Diocesan Trustees had been consulted about this land transfer, as it is believed the land and properties on ultimately are in the ownership of the Diocesan Trustee, and not the College? This would mean that any transfer of land would be to the Diocese and not directly to the ownership of the College. The Diocesan Trustees have already donated £500,00k to the development and this might be utilised for the purchases, or the diocesan Trustees might consider making an additional payment of £40k for the land acquisition? Clearly, there should be no delay in resolving the issue of the land acquisition so the works can be concluded. It was agreed the College would consult the Diocesan Trustees.

The Governors' Resources Premises HR Committee will be considering these and other issues in greater detail as the year proceeds.

The Board noted the report and agreed that the land should be acquired if possible.
