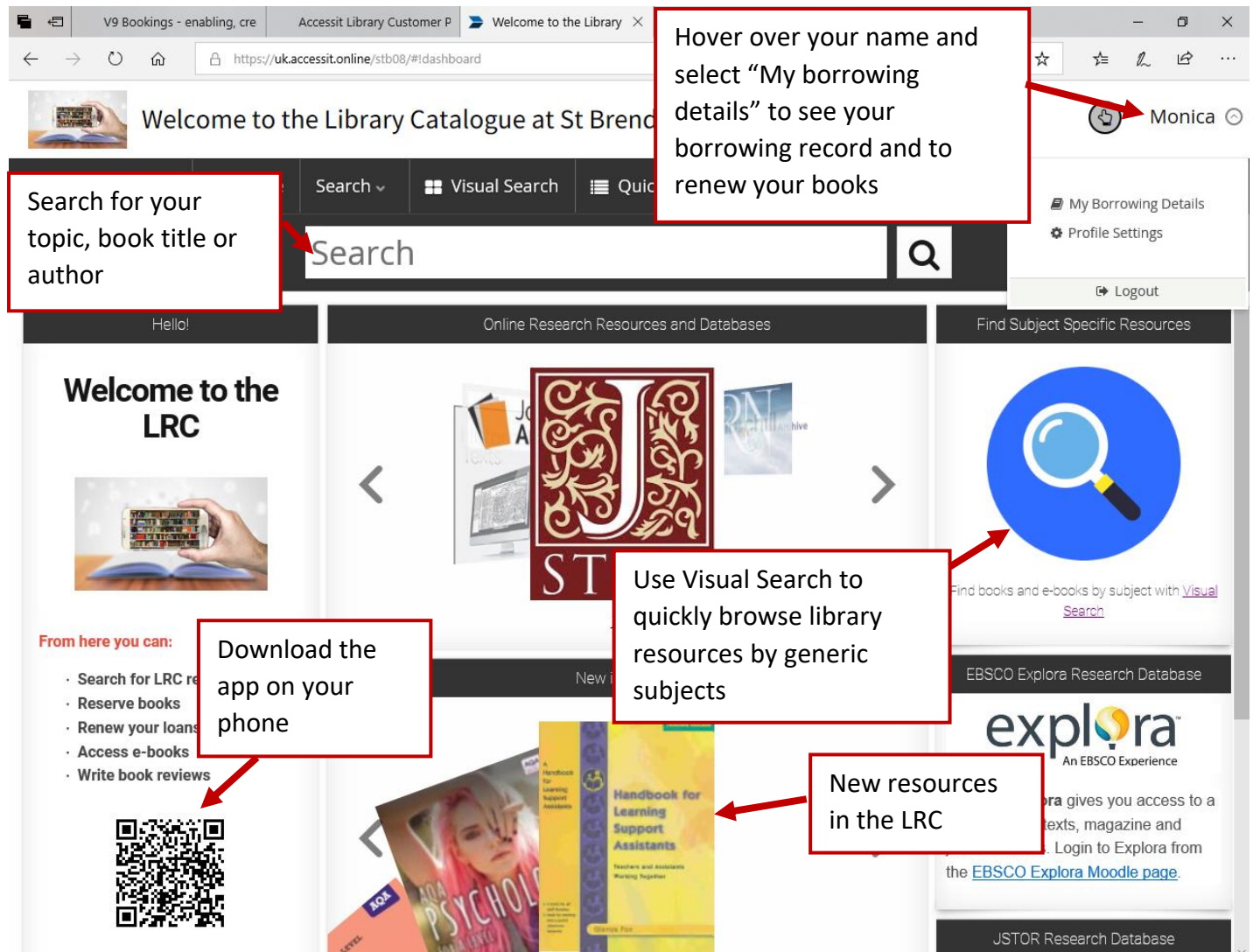

# How to search in AccessIt

Enter your search terms into the search box. Your search terms can be the title of a book, an author or a subject.

When you search in AccessIt, you will retrieve everything that is available in the LRC about that subject.

You can click on any resource to see more details.
