


## **How to access and navigate the College's Virtual Learning Platform (Moodle)**


1. Navigate to the College's website- <https://www.stbrn.ac.uk/>
2. Click on the Portal tab on top.
3. Click on the Moodle icon.
4. Log into Moodle using your College username (i.e. your student number) and Password.
5. Once logged in, you will land on the main page of Moodle (your dashboard) where you can find all your courses. Just click on the course you want to visit and you can access various course resources, uploaded by your Teacher. From here, you can also navigate to any Student Services site such as LRC, Careers or Learning Development.
6. On individual course sites, you will find sections for topics that will be covered throughout the year.
7. Within each section, you will find a number of resources (e.g. documents, presentations, external links) that you can use for your studies.
